• Hokitika Racecourse

- RSL have been contracted to work with stake holders and Sports Canterbury West Coast to
 - 1. Do an inventory of what we are lacking in terms of sports facilities
 - 2. To be working with the user groups
 - 3. And to look at the rural space at the back of the racecourse as to what could add the most benefit, efficient cost and sustainability.

Conversations with stakeholders are happening now regarding the above.

• Residential part of Racecourse

- Funding application has been sent to Kai Ora to see if funding can be firmed up regarding infrastructure upgrades that would allow more development of this area, and hope to get a response by the end of the month regarding this funding.

• Consents

- 82 applications since last committee meeting, 52 granted, 34 were for land use consents and 17 for sub-divisions.
- Still on 100% of meeting legal timeframes
