PŪRONGO KAIMAHI STAFF REPORTS

Adoption of the Annual Plan 2022 / 2023

Strategy and Communications Advisor, Emma Rae spoke to this item: Councillors had been provided with an Updated 'Annual Plan Report 2022-2023'.

1.1. The purpose of this report is to present the final draft Annual Plan 2022/2023 (Annual Plan) for adoption.

Please note that there was an error in the Quantity and Values figures for the Hokitika promotions rates in the indicative rates calculations were transposed with each other. This has been fixed and a new draft of the Annual Plan has been tabled with Councillors today.

The Strategy and Communications Advisor handed over to the Chief Executive to clarify some points:

2.2.2.3 In the report regarding Budget for Pakiwaitara building earthquake strengthening reduced to \$450,000:

That budget is not earthquake strengthening, but the budget is needed to make sure the building integrity was still maintained during the period of non-use or non-decision. There is some work at the back of the Pakiwaitara Building that needs some fixing, so the budget has been left there to be able to do those works. It may also be allocated to some engineering design for the EQ requirements.

2.2.2.9 Further work on the Hokitika Swimming pool deferred:

This refers to stage 3 of the Hokitika Swimming pool.

2.2.2.11 Apply for \$500,000 funding through the 'Better Off' Three Waters funding to complete the Cass Square pavilion:

Council hasn't approved any Tranche 2 funding for Better off Funding – this gets allocated closer to the 2024 date.
