- Brendon Russ, 120-180 mm and 60-80 mm on the Coast. Peak intensity 20-30 mm. Another 4 rours onto Westland. Peak intensity of 20-30 mm. Monitoring the rivers, Hokitika, Grey, Buller and Karamea Rivers.
- Buller River holding steadily, 6.8 metres, all the rivers north of Westport have dropped in the last 4 hours, peaked overnight, then dropped. Grey has gone up 1.5 m in the last few hours. Quite a

bit of rain, going up 1 m in the last 4 hours, Waiho River has remained quite high in the last 12 hours, Hokitika, Greymouth and Buller people on the ground doing river monitoring.

The briefing started with a Karakia.

Met Service update – 300 mm-400 m/r

Brendon Russ then provided an update. Still more rain to come. Not intensity over 400 mm per hour.

Hokitika has breached 2 alarms, titting around 4 metres; with the Waiho similarly, however it has been relatively stable. Grey very little esponse, unchanged hydro graph. Further north, eyes on the Buller, rivers have been quite low.

Action: Brendon to discuss with Met Service if the red warning should stay in place.

Buller – EOC will be operating over night.

Colin Hey from waka Kotahi – will the evacuation include the whole streets.

Al from Buller equised that information will be adjusted depending on information received from the hydrologist. Locking from cleaning everyone out from between the two bridges, look towards people going to Greymouth. The roads can close quite quickly so people will end up being isolated here.

Colin to the sure that's communicated to his team.

Al from Buller – we will make sure our partner agencies have been advised before activated.

Simon Bastion – still in a hold situation with Brendon looking at rivers. Very little activity in terms of breaches. Power outages Franz and Fox. Need to hear from Telco that batteries are up and charged. Dispatched 3 people down south from the response team. We know that more rain between 10pm-3.00 am, we are in a hold position at present. We are putting out a communications message regarding evacuation and where people will need to go to. Sending additional sandbags up to Buller from verticed Milk Products. We have a full team tonight and rostered on for tomorrow as well.

Grey District Council – Aaron, continuing to monitor the situation, initiated our floor protection plan, no reports of surface flooding around the district. Concerns in the past re the Cobden Bridge the concern at present. Tested some pumping stations and they re functioning correctly. Continuing to w tch the weather maps.

Te Aroha – thanks for participation in various EOC and stakeholders. Stepped up in terms of personnel in terms of admin functions. Trevor Watts on from 6.30 pm tonight.

Moira, Waka Kotahi, nothing to report. Everything is open. Roads are holding up well.

Rob, Chorus, power outage that has affected the Telco as well. Batteries the red and power it back on.

Nigel Shirley, Electronet – crews at Lake Mahinapua, restored power 25.00 pm.

Jamie Ruahui, Hamiria – Arahura Marae is available for evacuees, Portini Waiora staff are available in ECCs and satellite phones are charged.

Nils, St Johns – nothing currently.

Mark Kirkwood, Police – we have to be considered as part the planning process and would appreciate some communications.

Philip Wheble - O'Connor House – contingency planning at present. Most are evacuated. There will still be 15 on site. Teams at Health are planning. Emergency earn in South Westland if required. No one self isolating currently.

Tanne, MPI – farmers are doing okay.

Heather, MPI – we do have a temporary animal shelter in Buller, taking animals for those evacuating.

Rob Whaley – any essential workers that need to stay behind. Do they have to carry a card. Can some stay in place?

High intense rainfall for Westland with lots of thunderstorms. Going to be a long event. Will extend the warning until Friday midnight. Suller could get 350-450 mm about the ranges. Peak rates 20-25 or 30 mm at times. With the intense thunderstorms, it could give us up to 45-50 mm.

Rose, Hydrology, had 30-20 mm. Centred around Waiho. Had .6 rise for Hokitika, last 6 hours, 1 metre in Waiho and Haast Rivers. Expecting rivers to get quite high. Speaking to NIWA this morning, to get models and will be able to get those to Westland later today.

Moira, NZTA, Maintenance Contract Manager for the West Coast. Crews are out on the road, surface flooding in the usual sports, monitoring them. Porirua River is quite full already. Positive feedback on the diggers aready in strategic locations.

Nigel, Westpower – watching and monitoring. They have a crew at Franz already.

Gerard – to find out re energy contact person in Haast.

Mark, Greymouth Police. Redeployed teams to Fox and Haast. Extra teams from Nelson deployed. One will be based in Hokitika. Make sure to call 111 if you need assistance, don't use personal mobiles.

Philip Wheble, making sure there is medical cover (includes south as well).

James, NZ Red Cross, placed on standby 13 persons (mainly for Westport). Small team in Greymun. Other staff are on standby. Seeking clarity from this group to deploy persons as required. Croice Frown to talk to James after this morning.

Farming community – waiting to see what happens then ready to send out communications to their groups.

Lyn, MPI – Welfare resources in Grey and Westport are available to help in that role as vell (farming support).

There are concerns with the amount of rainfall and amount of accumulations. Controller was happy with an orange warning. Meeting with the FRAT team this afternoon, Jo Paterson was coming back with some information.

- Te Aroha – has a meeting with Jo Paterson and the FRAT team at 6.00 pm tonight.

- **EOC's, Simon Bastion** – busy morning, power outage down through the Westland Region, power has been restored, communications restored, standing the team downstairs.

- **Buller DOC** – refining the evacuation plan and its really difficult that we are still looking at modelling that is uncertain. Could be some issues, one is the Buller River and the other is isolation. Planning for the worst at present. Talked to our communities north, and there is a lot of rain coming up that way. Messages have gone out about self evacuation, and a lot of people have taken that up, reaching out to vulnerable people. Thanked everyone for their support.

- **Te Aroha Cook, Group Controller** – ECC continued support. Working with Planning, Intel, DHB and right protocols in place. In addition we have put in an additional request to NEMA for the mass evacuation. Identifying suitable persons for Group Control and Alternate Controllers for Buller DC for the weekend, including Monday. Stepped up Red Cross response. Watching to see what the weather does.

- Murray from the Met Service – Lisa Murray. Weather forecasters. Looking at the latest model/guidance and it looks steadyish with a bit if respite, but continuous rain for Buller and the Grey catchment and it looks to continue.

- **Buller District Council** – update on timing on the peak? Westport north. Heaviest falls will be from late morning Friday to the afternoon, then ease and move further north, then clearing overnight. Late am to mid afternoon for the heaviest rainfall.

- Brendon – Franz Josef/Waiau?

- Met Service – 15mm-20mm for Franz Josef/Waiau. Hokitika-Greymouth up to 20-25mm, Karamea 15-20mm then 25-30 Friday evening as the front moves through.

- Gary Knowles – intensity of the downpour.

- Met Service – mainly 25-30mm per hour, Friday afternoon. Briefly could see 30mm plus.

- **Grey District Council** – little change, on standby to see what the decision is regarding evacuation and people moving to our District.

- Moira, Waka Kotahi – SH6 from Franz to Haast is closed. Update is 4.00 pm on Friday. Assessing a number of slip sites. North of Hokitika is currently in good condition and open.

- Rob Whaley, Chorus – All the network is cleared and up and running.

- **Nigel, Electronet** – Fox south was out. Power back on, to Jacks Ridge, cleared vegetation on the lines near Bruce Bay, all power is now restored to the network.

- Clarke - sent a crew to Karamea.

- Hamiria – nothing to report.

- Rachael Forsyth – Bruce Bay School, over the highway, still couldn't get any further south due to water over the roads.
