Site visit completed in March. Stantec commissioned to complete a new design incorporating the hazard management. Stantec provided a draft review at the July 2021 meeting. Need to be considered for additional funding via the annual plan process.

Further hazard assessments to be completed as part of a larger safety audit for the trail.

#### **STAFF REPORTS**

#### Walking Access NZ – Verbal Update

Regional Field Advisor Inger Perkins, from New Zealand Walking Access Commission spoke to this report:

- 1Noted the purpose and roles of the New Zealand Walking Access Commission
- Role includes making submissions on plans, for example District Plan and Regional Land Transport Plan supporting practical and safe active transport within and between West Coast communities.
- Second version of Guidelines for the Management of Unformed Legal Roads due to be published soon following input from territorial authorities. Inger will be discussing unformed legal roads with Scott Baxendale, including the guidelines, road stopping processes and the council's policy regarding occupation.
- Noted that activities occupying legal roads must not interfere with the public's right to pass and repass.
- Noted and appreciated proposals for new tracks at Kumara Junction by community, improvements to footpath to enable safer access to Kaniere School, and repairs to the Heritage Trail around the racecourse.

Moved Cr Haddock, seconded D. Ritchie and **Resolved** that the Walking Access NZ verbal update from the Regional Field Advisor; Inger Perkins be received and that:

Inger Perkins name and number be distributed as a conduit for potential other walking routes to be evaluated.

#### Westland Mountain Bike Club – Verbal Update

David Ritchie speaking on behalf of Westland Mountain Bike Club.

#### 1. Blue Spur Forest Trail

- This is Ngai Tahu owned.
- Focus on improving access to forest and once you're in the forest.
- Working on climbing trails so there are no steep climbs on rocky gravel roads anymore.
   Improving the quality, safety and accessibility of existing network of trails rather than creating new ones.
- There has been an increased number of riders from outside the area, with a marked increase in the number of families and young ones riding the trails.
- Ensuring more intermediate rides available and progressive trails
- Conducted a leaf blower test where we tested the use of a leaf blower for track
  maintenance which was amazing and has transformed the way we maintain and develop
  our trails. We have applied for funding to buy ourselves a \$2000 leaf blower to ensure
  excellent maintenance of the trail network.
- Have increased reports of road incidents and near misses.

#### Cr Davidson arrived late to the meeting and will now take over chairing the meeting at 3.25pm

#### 2. Submission the Western Mountain Bike Club made to Council (screen shared)

- Around Lake Kaniere ride discussions with DOC and Back Country Trust and needs some further thought as this is a big project.
- Heritage Loop: New Loop proposed so it links to Blue Spur Track, links to town and links to Kaniere. Has basically been measured out no financial estimates have been made.
