The Application

Katsu Hokitika Limited applies for the renewal; and variation of the ON Licence in respect of premises situated at 19 Tancred Street, Hokitika known as "**Katsu Sushi & Noodle House.**"

This business operates as a Class 3 restaurant/cafe in central Hokitika and seek to include a newly permitted outdoor dining area as depicted in the new plan dated 21 January 2026.

The current days and hours are **Monday to Sunday 10.00am to 10.00pm. No changes are sought.**

These hours are within the default national maximum trading hours for an on licence of 8.00am to 4.00am.

The applicant has provided a list of substantive food options and the low alcohol and non-alcoholic refreshments that are available at all times when the premises is open for the sale and supply of alcohol.

The food is prepared on-site, and the inspector is satisfied that it is of an acceptable variety and price range and is provided within a reasonable timeframe of placing an order.

The application was publicly notified on council's website from 3 November 2025, and no public objections were received.

Neither the Police nor the Medical Officer of Health raised any matters in opposition.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The applicant has provided an acceptable menu together with a list of both low and non-alcoholic refreshments that will satisfy the requirements of the Act.

The applicant must ensure that a certificated manager is on duty at all times when they are open for the sale and supply of alcohol. Additional certificated managers must be employed to fully cover the permitted hours if utilised

The Inspector reports that the amenity and good order of the area has not been reduced by more than a minor extent.

No designation is required for this low-risk activity. We grant the variation to the licensed footprint and include the outdoor area into the overall licensed area.

Subject to the above, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act.

Accordingly, I deal with the renewal application on the papers.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairman, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **approves** an application by **Katsu Hokitika Limited** for the renewal and variation of the ON Licence in respect of premises situated at 19 Tancred Street, Hokitika known as "**Katsu Sushi & Noodle House**" subject to conditions.


Conditions:

The licence is subject to the conditions listed as follows:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours:
Monday to Sunday 10.00am to 10.00pm;
2. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person other than a person who is on the premises to dine;

3. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises;
4. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages;
5. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted;
6. **A properly appointed certificated, or Acting or Temporary, manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises;**
7. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises;
8. The Licensee must display:
 - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol;
 - c. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.
