2020 Review of Westland District Council Speed Limits Register

1. Summary

- 1.1. The purpose of this report is to hear and receive submissions on the 2020 Review of Westland District Council Speed Limits Register.
- 1.2. This issue arises from the requirements of s 156(1)(a)(i) and (ii) of the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA) to consult when amending a bylaw.
- 1.3. Council seeks to meet its obligations under the Local Government Act 2002 and the achievement of the District Vision adopted by the Council in May 2018, which are set out in the Long Term Plan 2018-28. Refer page 2 of the agenda.
- 1.4. This report concludes by recommending that Council hear and receive the verbal and written submissions to 2020 Review of Westland District Council Speed Limits Register and directs staff to formulate a recommendation to the next Council meeting on any changes to be made to the Speed Limits Register.

2. Background

- 2.1. Council agreed to conduct public consultation under Section 83 of Local Government Act 2002 at a regular Council meeting on 24 September 2020.
- 2.2. The consultation document proposed a significant number of speed limit changes for numerous roads throughout the Westland District Roading Network. Any changes will be an amendment to the current schedule of speed limits that forms the appendix to the current Speed Limits Bylaw.
- 2.3. Public consultation commenced on 29 September 2020 and closed on 30 October 2020 (31 days).

3. Current Situation

- 3.1. Council received 168 submissions.
- 3.2. In general, the submissions received were split 79 in favour and 89 opposed. Of the 89 opposed 30 were specifically from the Kokatahi/Kowitirangi area. Of those specific 30 there were 12 that were still in favour of the proposed CBD reduction. Four submitters were generally in favour of the changes but opposed the CBD changes.
- 3.3. Submission feedback raised the following:

- 3.3.1 The time taken to get anywhere will increase greatly. This is a misconception. Travel times will only increase greatly over long distances. For example, travelling at the maximum posted speed limit from Hokitika to the Hokitika Gorge the calculated travel time will extend by approximately 5.5 minutes in total for the 33km trip.
- 3.3.2 Greater spending on the roads will fix issues resulting in crashes.
 - Realistically this is not an affordable option for Westland District ratepayers.
- 3.3.3 This is a revenue gathering exercise for the police. This is not true. Reducing speed aims to reduce avoidable accidents as part of the Road to Zero strategy.
- 3.3.4 There are no accidents on these roads, so what are we trying to fix? Many of the accidents on these roads are not reported. In terms of accidents per road user the West Coast features quite high up on the national list. There are fewer serious injury crashes or fatalities because there are low traffic numbers in at risk areas.
- 3.3.5 Modern cars are much safer than older cars. This is true, however, speed can determine the result in a crash. Reduced speeds can assist drivers to recover from mistakes made.

4. Options

- 4.1. Option 1:
 - 4.1.1.Do not hear and consider submissions to the 2020 Review of Westland District Council's Speed Limits Register.
- 4.2. Option 2:
 - 4.2.1. Hear and consider the submissions.
 - 4.2.2. Direct staff to formulate a recommendation to the next Council meeting on any changes to be made to the Speed Limits Register.

5. Risk Analysis

5.1. Risk has been considered and no risks have been identified.

6. Health and Safety

6.1. Health and Safety has been considered and no items have been identified.

7. Significance and Engagement

- 7.1. The level of significance has been assessed as being high under Council's Significance and Engagement Policy.
- 7.2. Public consultation was undertaken under Section 83 of Local Government Act 2002 from 29 September 2020 to 30 October 2020. This was advertised through social media, the local newspaper, Council's Website and specific invitation to Waka Kotahi, NZ Police, NZ AA, and NZ Heavy Haulage Association.

8. Assessment of Options (including Financial Considerations)

- 8.1. Option 1: Council has an obligation to hear and consider submissions. To do nothing would breach Council's obligations under the LGA.
- 8.2. Option 2: Hearings are an important part of community consultation and engagement. Council needs to understand the community's view on amendments to speed limits.

8.3. There are no financial implications to carrying out a hearing.

9. Preferred Option(s) and Reasons

- 9.1. The preferred option is Option 2.
 - 9.1.1. Hear and consider the submissions.
 - 9.1.2. Direct staff to formulate a recommendation to the next Council meeting on any changes to be made to the Speed Limits Register.

Option 2 is the preferred option as it allows for fair consideration of all submissions received.

10. Recommendation(s)

- 10.1. That Council receive the report.
- 10.2. That Council hear and receive the written and verbal submissions.
- 10.3. That Council direct staff for formulate a recommendation to the next Council meeting on any changes to be made to the Speed Limits Register.

I strongly support the proposed Old Christchurch Road speed limits. I have lived on this road for 14 years and and had many experiences of serious accidents, and minor accidents. On top of this we have frightening near misses at least weekly.

The current posted speed of 100 km means that some local drivers try to use it as a "shortcut" to Christchurch and often travel at 100km or over to ensure that it is faster. The narrow and unsealed road conditions means they are an extreme danger to other motorists, cycle trail users, residents and themselves. Even on the seal the road is narrow and can be slippery in the wet, so a more conservative speed limit is desirable.

This is a service road not a state highway and lower speed limits mean that it is more likely to be used as such. If lower speed limits are in place it will mean that tourists are not diverted down this road by their GPS meaning less people get into trouble on the gravel roads they are not used to driving on. The GPS will calculate that it is quicker to travel on the State Highway.



Reduction of speed to 30km/hr around Hokitika CBD. Because I like the idea of making the CBD more pedestrian- & cycle- & tourist- friendly, and it'll have almost nil effect on travel times and no real inconvenience to drivers.

For other locations I generally agree that vehicles should be driven economically to reduce environmental impacts, but I'm not sure that the proposed widespread reduction in speed limits will be a fair and effective way to do it. Most of the proposed changes should have additional closer consultation with specific local and regular users, so that they get buy-in. Or maybe temporary trials as done at Hokitika CBD. Do you disagree with any proposed speed limit changes? Why?

Most of the reductions are not necessary. I don't agree with the statement that "Reducing speed limits on appropriate roads will have little effect on travel times as most drivers currently drive to similar speeds as the proposed changes." The average speed limit means that at least 50% of drivers go over that limit, and many more than that number probably exceed the average limit for some portion of the journey. Drivers have to stay at or under the speed limit for the whole of the journey.

So I think many of the reductions will be an inconvenience to a lot of the locals, and will end up costing them significant amounts of time or money (speeding fines).

Examples are the Lake Kaniere Road and Kokatahi-Kowhitirangi Rd, which do not need to be reduced to 80kph.

Are there any other comments you would like to make regarding the proposed changes?

The table given in the consultation document (in alphabetical order, with no reference to location!) was hard to follow, and I did not receive any reply from WDC staff when I asked for a map or similar. This made it hard to know what's proposed (eg where's Beach Rd?).

One of the things I like about Hokitika is its compact layout on SH6, unlike Greymouth which goes on for miles. Reducing speeds on local council roads around the Hokitika area (eg Golflinks, Kaniere, Keoghans) could encourage NZTA to needlessly extend the slow zone around Hokitika.

Tēnā koe,

The Department of Conservation (DOC) would like to express its support for the proposed speed change to Forks-Okarito Road, from 100km/h to 60km/h within the 2020 Review of Westland District Council Speed Limits Register. The Forks-Okarito Road runs through Westland Tai Poutini National Park and the Okarito Kiwi Sanctuary, home to the nationally vunerable rowi kiwi. The rowi is a tāonga to Ngāi Tahu Kāti Māhaki ki Makaawhio and has a special significance to the West Coast of New Zealand, being the rarest kiwi species.

The South Westland District Office of DOC in conjunction with Te Rūnanga o Makaawhio use Operation Nest Egg (ONE) as the primary management tool used for rowi. Eggs are rescued from Okarito sanctuary and incubated at the West Coast Wildlife Centre, once hatched the chicks are held at an off-site facility for up to two months before being transferred to a predator free island within the Marlborough Sounds for the first year of their lives. Once the rowi are at a suitable size to defend themselves from predators, we then release them back into the sanctuary.

As it stands, with the speed limit at the present 100km/h we have had several rowi struck and killed by road vehicles. We believe that road users travelling at the proposed speed of 60km/h should have sufficient time to react to a kiwi on the road, braking to avoid a collision, and in turn preserving our tāonga.

The South Westland District Office of DOC is currently investigating potential upgrades to the roadside signage warning road users of the presence of kiwi and the risk vehicles pose to them.  - o What are the accident statistics for each of the roads being considered for reduced speed limits? Decisions should be fact based.
 - What is the basis for the term "successful" being applied to the early 2019 testing of alternative speed limits?
 - Why is the review being brought forward from the normal 2023 review requirement?
 - o Where is the evidence that; "most drivers currently drive to similar speeds as the proposed changes"?. If that is the case there is no basis for speed restrictions as negligible safety improvement would be expected.
- I also think the underlying assertions need looking at:
 - Is saving money by not improving road quality acceptable, just because reducing speed limits is cheaper?
 - Paragraph 7 refers to "a perceived problem";
 - What is it or are they

Where and when is the problem occurring, or did it occur. And what

- remedial action was immediately taken to maintain safety?
 - Are "visitors" the perceived problem, or GPS the culprit? .
- o Paragraph 5 states the obvious, regarding speed and result. Benefit and risk are a daily balancing act and best determined by the individual "driving to the conditions".
- Paragraph 2 refers to positive public feedback following the early 2019 trial. My impression was it was a complete failure, and badly mishandled.
- o Paragraph 9 refers to Police enforcement..... this is a red herring.... The Police can react to any driving they consider "unsafe", no matter what the speed limit

My Submission

I will be directing my comments only to one specific road under review; one that I am very familiar with. That is Lake Kaniere Road 582 to 12500.

However, you may find my comments useful when considering other roads in the district that are also under review.

I have travelled Lake Kaniere Road probably 3 times per week for the past 20 years, and while my memory may be suspect I do not recall a serious accident that has been caused by excessive speed.

This road has such variation over the 12 kilometers it is not easy to make general statements that are applicable it's full length. Long straights and tighter sections make it a good example of many of New Zealand's country roads. The "mean speed" of 75-79 suggests some regularity, and therefore I believe misleading in this forum. I refute the assertion in Paragraph 1, "most drivers currently drive to similar speeds as the proposed changes". On the Lake Kaniere Road from my own experience speeds up to 100kph are common and safe on appropriate sections.

Lake Kaniere is a popular holiday and scenic destination, consequently the road users change over time and in type. In winter months it is common to only see one or two cars during a trip, and in summer a constant (albeit) low volume of traffic travelling the road. There are limited places to overtake a "cruising" campervan, which is at times frustrating, but accepted in the thought Why hurry?

My total experience has been of sensible driving, and a well- balanced driving to the conditions. And this includes up to the speed limit of 100kph.

There are sections of the road that are clearly okay for 100kph, good width, straight, and clear views. And there are other sections where THE MAXIMUM speed limit is not appropriate.

I fear in this review to much thought is being given to inexperienced foreign drivers and drivers of low capacity who are PERCIEVED to be causing risk.

Summary

- The review appears to be blindly following a NANNY STATE trend, where increasing central regulation and control are replacing individual responsibility.
- I suggest this whole exercise be given back to Staff for more research, data acquisition and re-thinking, and come back to Council for consideration in 2023.

Mayor and Councillors – when considering this submission, where I am predominantly relating my comments to the Lake Kaniere Road. Please look at the broader review through other <u>local</u> eyes, and consider the effect on their lives and productivity for suspect real gain.

Traffic rarely travels along Kaniere Road at the posted speed limit. The traffic accelerates well past the posted 80km most of the day and especially at night. Many exceeding 100km along this road particularly between 6.30 and 10pm. There are many cars navigate this road safely at this speed and most of the accidents occur because of overtaking, lack or adherence to the posted speed limits. The danger is the numerous drive ways that lead on to this road and the large ditches on the other side of the road. This is often where cars end up as the road is not sufficiently wide enough to allow overtaking (road markings are not double yellow and should be). I suggest that you stick with the posted limits and work on a much more robust plan to curb speeding and overtaking along Kaniere road as these are the factors that cause the accidents along this stretch of road.

The vehicles that travel up and along Adairs road and through the valley navigate these roads with the current speed limits that are in place.

Having 30/40/50/60/70 and 80 km per hour signage will cause much confusion to tourists and locals alike, Stick to three speeds and make these zones as large as possible without multiple changes of speed along one road which will increase compliance and reduce confusion. It is just too much to be constantly looking for the change of speed signs.

Many of the proposed changes to 30km are much too slow and will greatly increase travel times and reduce compliance with other posted speed limits.

For example: if I operated a business in upper Kokatahi for each service I require delivered/picked up to my business will require an average of 10-15 minutes in additional travel for each service. Cost around these changes will inevitable pass on to uses, most of who are also ratepayers.

• Costs associated with these proposed changes will fall upon ratepayers.

• Reductions in speed limits alone Kaniere Road will result in the delayed in the response of Fire and Emergency vehicles being crew by volunteers who live in Kaniere.

• Reductions in speed limits will increase response time for emergency vehicle. While it is true some emergency vehicle have a legal defense to exceed posted limits this is limited by policy and priority of the emergency. A reduction in speed limits will delay emergency response with adverse outcomes as a result.

• With the increasing number of vehicles with collision avoidance, lane assist and other smart driving additions this continues to make driving safer.

I generally support the proposal

Which proposed speed limit changes do you support? Why?

I support Adairs Road speed limit being reduced to 60km/hr. Adairs Road has many blind spots and corners, varied users, heavy vehicles, cycles, horses, motor cyclists, and dust or greasy dirt under foot/wheel, depending on the conditions on the day. 60km/hr is a good speed, it should not be any higher.

I support the **Old Christchurch Road** being reduced to 60km/hr on the gravel and 80km/hr on the seal. This will help to reduce the current unacceptable accident rate, often serious accidents, and help to keep the community safer.

Do you disagree with any proposed speed limit changes? Why?

Takutai Road is proposed to be 80km/hr. It has a Safe and appropriate speed of 60km/hr. I disagree strongly with this. Takutai Road should be limited to 60km/hr maximum. This would adhere to the safe and appropriate speed, and acknowledge that the road is short, has no markings, no shoulder, and is frequently used by cyclists, walkers with dogs, horses and farm vehicles. The shape of the road means there is visibility from one end to the other is impossible. Takutai Road is also used by the school bus twice daily which has two stops on it. I propose the safe and appropriate speed for Takutai Road is adhered to at a limit of 60km/hr.

Golf Links Road is proposed to be 80km/hr. I disagree strongly with this. Golf Links Road should be limited to 60km/hr maximum. The following points set out why it should be set at 60km/hr:

- Significant increase in the number of houses along the road, with driveways onto Golf Links Road and multiple vehicle movements daily
- Local residents biking, walking, often with dogs, horses
- School bus route, multiple stops along Golf Links Road
- Now part of the celebrated West Coast Wilderness trail, whereby numerous groups of multiple cyclists use the road, often very relaxed, cruising, side by side, down the country road. Very risky to pass these cyclists at more than 50km/hr, easier if only have to slow a little, can react quicker.
- Hokitika Golf Club members create busy waves of vehicles on the road, travelling at speed, racing to tee off. Many of these vehicles are now towing trailers with golf buggies, which bounce heavily along the corrugated surface.

- Generally approximately 5 6metres wide, with no road markings and no shoulder along its entire length.
- Deep ditch is on much of one side of the road.
- Corrugations across the road for its entire length
- Has a tricky sight line, the whole road disappears from either end when driving, due to the natural rise in the road, the rise being where there are a number of driveways accessing private dwellings.

Hau Hau Rd would best serve our community if it were to remain as a 50km/hr road from the Wheelbarrow at Prossers Bush corner past the transfer station up the hill to the top where the road flattens and widens. Numerous vehicles, runners, cyclists, dog walkers, disabled people on horseback, exit the Boys Brigade driveway onto Hau Hau Rd, while vehicles often with trailers head to the dump, large trucks ply the road, and further on the difficult and narrow bends mean slower is safer.

Are there any comments you would like to make regarding the proposed changes?

With regard to Golf Links Road, the road has for some time now lost the country road feel, and more often feels like a race track. It is one side of the triangle that is Golf Links Road, Takutai Road and State Highway 6. There are often cars that race that triangle and there is no way to stop or slow these people down, on what is a narrow section of rural road with no shoulder and plenty of varied users, including children on their own, on bikes or on foot. The road has lost the feel of the relaxed pace of rural living in Westland. It is now a road where I feel nervous and I actively avoid using the road when I can, although it is out my gate in my neighbourhood, and I am an avid walker, cyclist and horse rider. On top of all that, I have never seen a police car on it, keeping drivers honest, encouraging sensible speed, so we must set drivers a suitable, safe speed for all users.



Yes.

1. The lowering of the CBD speed limit to 30kph is ridiculous. You would be hard pressed to get above 30 in most of this area as almost every block terminates with either a roundabout or a stop sign. It will also discourage visitors to town from entering the CBD, as has happened since Greymouth moved to a 30k CBD. Most of us now just follow the main highway to the Warehouse/Countdown rather than driving through the retail district. One size does not fit all and we should learn from the mistakes that are evident in Greymouth and Christchurch's experiment with this concept.

2. Kaniere Road to 60kph. Again, a counter-productive idea. At one end is West Roads and at the other WMP, the two biggest fleets of commercial vehicles in Westland. The lowering of the speed limit through here by 25% will have economic impacts for these two companies and the wider community. This road consists of two long wide straights and an S bend. It is generally a very safe road apart from the open drain along the northern side of it. If what we are worried about is safety the best answer would be to pipe this and remove the hazard, and perhaps put a yellow advisory sign at the S bend. As youngster I lived along here and during my primary school years I delivered the local newspaper six days a week on a pushbike. At the time there were no footpaths, open drains on both sides and a 100kph speed limit. Surely the roads haven't gotten so bad in Westland that we now need to lower this to 60kph? With the section that goes through Kaniere Township, I am happy for that decision to be left to its residents.

3. Stafford Loop Road. This one beats the band. The entire population of Stafford presented the Mayor and Councillors with a petition asking that the speed limit be lowered from Rafferty's Creek to the Waimea bridge, essentially along High Street within the old town boundary. This was because the current open road speed limit in this particularly section is hazardous. There are about 20 access-ways leading onto the tarseal, many on blind bends and crests, including the Scandinavia Street intersection (which it appears will remain at 100kph). The proposal to lower the limit to 60kph for the entire 22km length of the road from Arahura to Dillmanstown is not only ridiculous but also counter-productive from a safety perspective. When visitors are driving along here and find that they are limited to 60kph along lengthy straights that can be quite safely driven at 100mph they will do what the locals will no doubt do and drive to the conditions, knowing that enforcement is unlikely to be present on such a relatively unused road. Once they reach the area that the locals are concerned about they will have no warning that this is a particularly dangerous area. If we were to go back to the idea of having an approximately 1km length that is know to be dangerous limited, this would highlight the danger.

The proposed 60kph through the entire 22kms of Stafford Loop Road would also effectively kill the proposed Seddon Trail, which has been worked towards for the last 4 years by Heritage Hokitika and

Heritage New Zealand, stone dead.

4. Old Christchurch Road. With people living up to 16kms along this road, the commute is going to be increased severely, should they choose to abide by the proposed by-law.

WDC have done a wonderful job at the SH73 end of discouraging tourists from using what is quite frankly one of the most hazardous roads in the area, if the number of tow trucks going through here during the tourist season are anything to go by. Signage and a large turnaround area have given people relying on GPS the opportunity to seek a safer route to Hokitika. This is of course the opposite of what was done at the Arahura end where white lines have recently been painted down the middle of the tar-seal to make it look attractive to the same tourists going the other way. This on a road so narrow that you almost have to pull over to the side of the road to let a milk tanker go past in the opposite direction.

Are there any other comments you would like to make regarding the proposed changes?

If there is one thing that is guaranteed to cause antipathy and resentment in Coasters towards authority it is the imposition of pointless rules, particularly when it forces them to do what they are happy to do of their own free will. Looking over the discussion document it is plain that, more often than not, most people already travel at speeds below those proposed because they drive to the conditions and use their common sense.

If Council is serious about using traffic speed limits to increase safety there are two things they can do. Firstly, acquiesce with the request from the ratepayers and residents of Stafford to impose the limit where, and only where, they have requested. Secondly, request that NZTA move the 50kph limit on SH6 at the northern end of Hokitika to north of the information kiosk so that people visiting the glow worm dell after dark are walking and parking in a 50k zone rather than an 80k one.

I have calculated that the proposed speed limits would increase my commute alone by an extra 12 minutes per day. If I had the desire and enough free time to waste it with an extra hour a week sitting in my car I'd move to Auckland.

Finally, as we all know, there are only two sorts of people on the roads. There are lunatics (people who drive faster than us) and morons (people who drive slower than us). Should Council adopt this proposal they will have voted for a policy that panders to morons.

Active West Coast

Active West Coast (AWC) is a network of agencies and groups committed to improving the health of West Coasters through the promotion of healthy lifestyles such as increased physical activity, improved nutrition, living smokefree, youth and older person's health. While member organisations were involved in preparing this submission, the recommendations in their entirety, do not necessarily reflect the views of each individual agency.

We commend Council for seeking to protect the safety of visitors and residents of the district. We support the proposed changes within the wider Westland District and make the following comments:

Rural roads and towns

As described in the proposal, gazetting speed limits more appropriate to the roading environment, especially on rural open roads, is a way to improve road safety and crash outcomes. This is in line with the NZTA Road to Zero Strategy to 'Improve road safety of our cities and regions through infrastructure improvements and speed management." The proposed changes to more residential areas within the district (ie Haast, Fox, Franz and Kaniere) will also assist in protecting more vulnerable road users such as walkers, cyclists and children, especially where the changes are proposed near schools.

There is a need to be proactive regarding road safety in areas that have or are experiencing development. For example, the area that includes Keoghans Road and Providence Drive. Keoghans Road is hazardous especially when considering it is an area of recent residential growth, has no footpaths, contains the entrance to a large-

truck industry and is the feeder street to the holiday park on Providence Drive. We therefore definitely support reduced speed limits along both Keoghans Road and Providence Drive, especially as the mean speed for both streets is currently significantly lower than the current 100kms limit.

As noted in the proposal many drivers within the district are already lowering their speed to around the proposed limits. This should facilitate compliance and lessen the need for huge resource in enforcement.

Hokitika CBD

We support the introduction of the 30km per hour speed limit within the Hokitika CBD as slower vehicle speeds improve safety and attractiveness for walkers, cyclists and other vulnerable road users. We consider the reduced speed limit is another step towards building a more attractive and accessible CBD.

Lowering speeds is a universal way of supporting pedestrianism and, as Dr Ben Rossiter from Victoria Walks stated at the New Zealand Walking and Cycling conference in 2018, "walkers are the indicator species for the health and liveability of an urban area". Furthermore liveable spaces, including lower speed limits, are designed to support accessibility across the age and ability spectrum.

The reduced speed limit was also recommended by Dr Rod Tolley when he visited the Westland District in 2018. Dr Tolley is an international expert on building connected, vibrant and economically successful communities through good urban design and transport controls that promote walking and cycling. He outlined how creating pedestrian and cycle friendly spaces has a range of community benefits, from increased road safety to better health and economic outcomes. We expect that the lower speed limits within the CBD will enhance the experience of the growing numbers of people travelling to use the Wilderness Trail. This may mean visitors will choose to stay longer and spend more time and money in the district.

We support the extension of this limit along both Tancred and Sewell Streets to Hampden Street as this will support safety for residents of the pensioner housing and pupils of the school in this area.

We note that the ends of both Camp Street and Stafford Streets (between Revell Street and Beach Street) appear to have not been included in this proposal. We could not find any reference to these areas already having a low speed limit and recommend that these street areas be included in the proposed 30km speed limit.

As the consultation document states there are very few accidents in the areas concerned ,due to speeding The immense change in foreign tourist numbers, I feel negates the concern mentioned in the consultation document regarding visitors to the coast. I do understand that NZ drivers and have to some extent, filled the gap, so to speak , but in this regard it must be considered that they would be well versed in NZ road conditions and appropriate driving standards.

There are overriding laws regardless of speed restriction signage, in that a Driver must drive to the conditions and Safe speed guidelines. In that,

You can drive at any speed under or equal to the limit, provided:

your speed is safe for the traffic conditions (for example, slow down if you are on a busy road, or if there are pedestrians or cyclists around)

your speed is safe for the road conditions (for example, slow down if the road is winding, bumpy, narrow, wet or icy)

your speed is safe for the weather conditions (for example, slow down if it is raining, windy or foggy) you can stop suddenly behind a vehicle that you're following – if a vehicle ahead of you stops suddenly and you run into the back of it, you will be legally responsible

you can stop in half the length of clear road you can see in front of you on a road with no centre line or lanes (for example, a narrow country road where vehicles may meet head-on)

you can stop in the length of clear lane you can see in front of you on a road with a centre line or lanes.

There are approximately 93 proposed roads under consideration which could ,depending on requirements, result in 186 new signs. I would expect that the cost of not only purchasing the compliant signage but also their placement would be considerable. Sadly, there were no costings mentioned in the consultation document.

Therefore I ask Council to shelve the proposal considering the Speed limit Revue.

I generally support the proposal.

I support Adairs Road speed limit being reduced to 60km per hour. The road has many blind corners, loose gravel and heavy vehicle use. I believe that 60 km per hour is a much safer speed for all users.

Golf Links Road is proposed to be 80km per hour. I disagree with this proposal and believe the speed should be reduced to 60 km per hour. This would be much safer for all users. This is supported by many others residents on Golf Links Road. Reasons include:

- There are at least 20 properties on Golf Links Road with driveways onto the road with multiple movements per day. Many properties have young children who also use the road to bike or walk to the beach and friends houses along the road. Horses are also ridden along the road
- The road now forms part of our fantastic Wilderness Cycle trail and often there are riders 2 or 3 abreast riding the trail. It is very risky to pass these cyclists at more than 50 km per hour and it is much easier to slow and safely pass if the speed is reduced.
- The road is part of the school bus route with multiple stops for kids to get on and off the bus
- The road leds to the popular Golf Course and Southside beach access used by main locals and tourists, meaning traffic on this road has greatly increased in recent years.
- The road is approximately 5-6 metres in width and has no road markings or signage. There is no clear safe verge / shoulder to safely pull over onto if needed especially dangerous if the speed if kept high at 80km per hour. In fact one side of the road has a deep ditch alongside for the majority of the length of the road.

To this end, it seems that an 80KM limit will provide little relief to our local area regarding outside traffic using our road as an alternative highway. If the road speed limit were to be 80KM further consideration needs to be explored lowering the speed to 60KM along various areas along old Christchurch Road.


