**DECISION OF THE WESTLAND DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE ON AN
UNCONTESTED APPLICATION**

AUTHORITY:

Pursuant to section 191(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 and a Council resolution dated 28 November 2013, the functions, powers and duties of the Westland District Licensing Committee are delegated to the committee chairperson where no objection has been filed, and no matters of opposition have been raised by the Police, the Medical Officer of Health or an Inspector. There is no Local Alcohol Policy in place for the District.

Summary of Evidence

The complete file has been made available to me.

A report from the Inspector concludes that the applicant is suitable to continue to hold a manager's certificate.

The Police advise that there is no objection to the application.

Evaluation of Evidence

I have considered the application on the basis of the uncontested reports received. The matter is able to be dealt with on the papers.

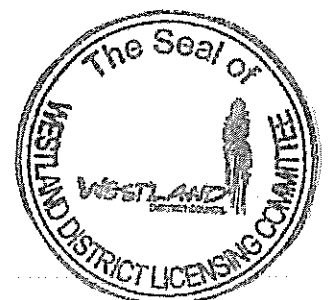
I note that the applicant is the holder of a relevant Licence Controller qualification, is in active employment in the industry, has not been convicted of any felony and has been found to be suitable to continue as a holder of a manager's certificate.

Decision and Reasons


I am satisfied as to those matters provided for in s.227 of the Act.

The application is granted on the papers pursuant to s.202 (1) of the Act as Decision Number **057-2019** and I direct that renewed manager's certificate be issued to Narinderjit Singh pursuant to s.64 of the Act.

The renewal is on the existing terms and conditions for a period of three years from the date of expiry.
