These are some of our most popular sources:

BIOGRAPHICAL CARD INDEX

Contains thousands of references to West Coast people.

PIONEER FAMILY REGISTER

Contains information on approximately 2,000 West Coast families.

DIRECTORIES AND ELECTORAL ROLLS

A selection of directories and electoral rolls from 1866 to recent times.

CEMETERY RECORDS

Burial registers and/or headstone transcriptions for most West Coast cemeteries.

BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES

- St Mary's Catholic Church marriage register index 1865-1913.
- Catholic baptism index.
- Anglican Church records index.
- Presbyterian Church marriage & baptism indexes.
- Waimea Goldfields births and death index 1868-1920.
- A collection of over 4,000 obituaries, funeral sheets etc.
- School admission registers often give date of birth information.


